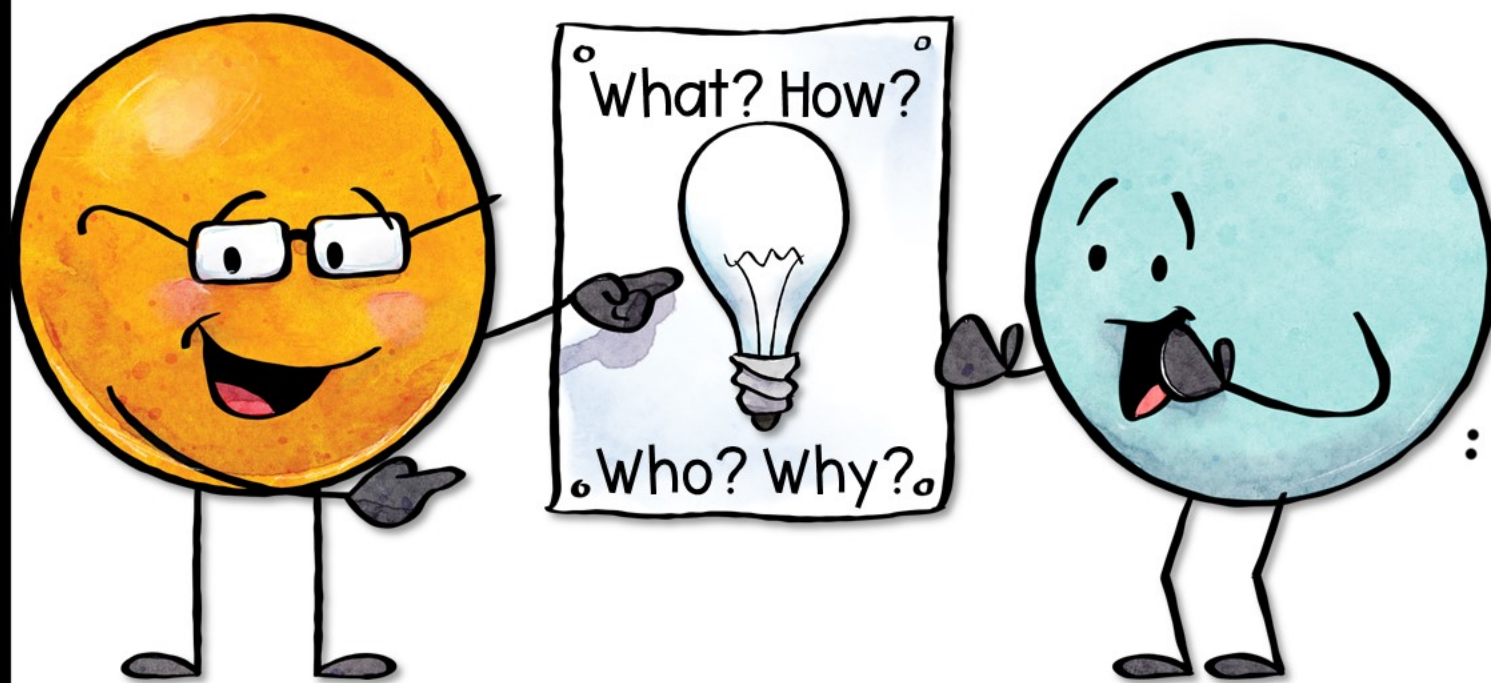


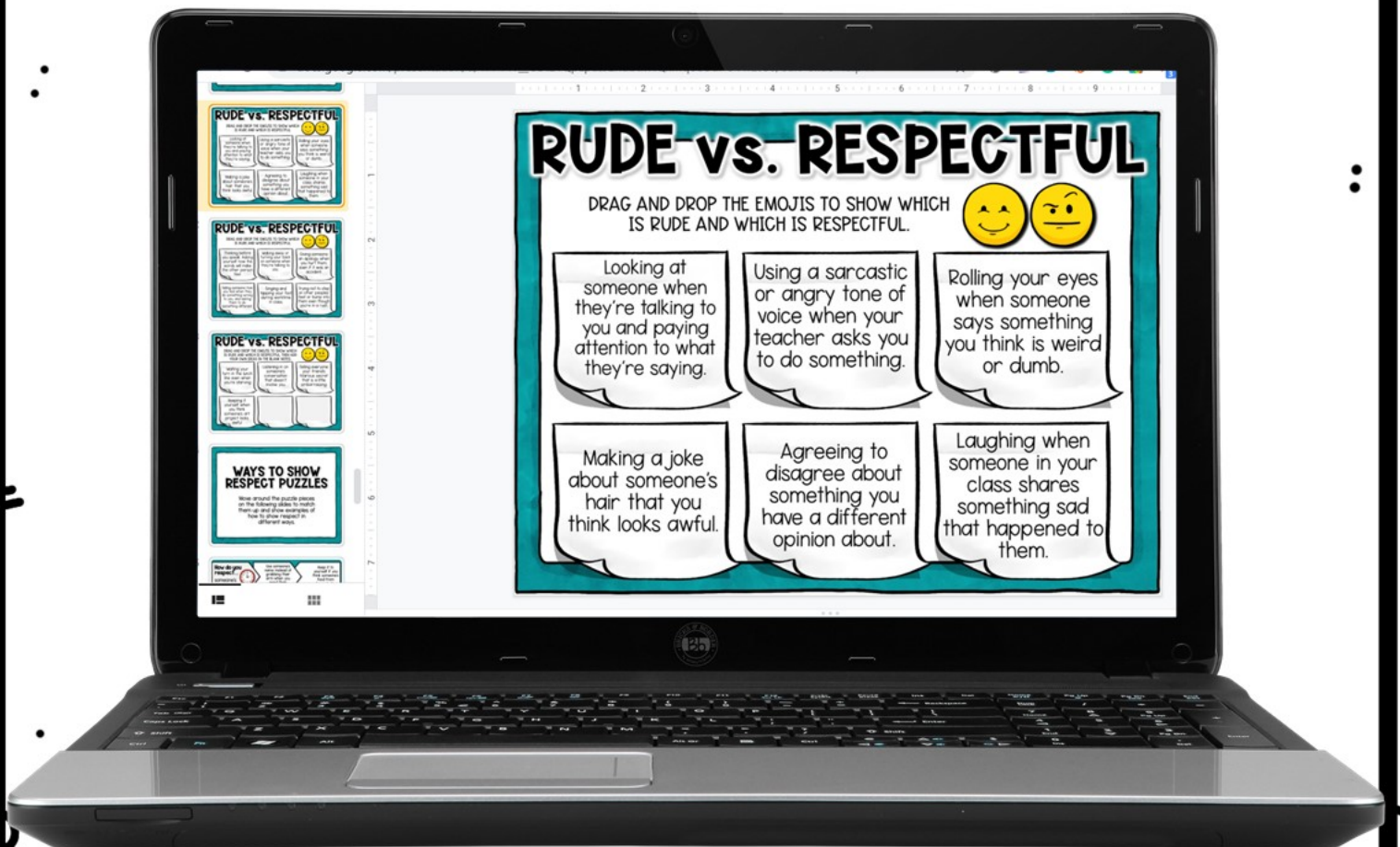

RUDE vs. RESPECTFUL

Looking at someone when they're talking to you and paying attention to what they're saying.	Using a sarcastic or angry tone of voice when your teacher asks you to do something.	Rolling your eyes when someone says something you think is weird or dumb.

Making a joke about someone's hair that you think looks awful.	Agreeing to disagree about something you have a different opinion about.	Laughing when someone in your class shares something sad that happened to them.
RUDE	RESPECTFUL	RUDE

How do you respect someone's belongings?

Ask to borrow something instead of taking it

Be careful with your food at lunch so it doesn't get all over someone's clothes or shoes

Ways to Show Respect Puzzles (10)

Help someone when they're stuck on something instead of laughing at them

Say "I feel hurt when you call me that name. Please don't say that anymore."

Choose not to do something just because "everyone else is doing it" and instead do what you think is right.

Rude vs. Respectful Cards (16)

Rolling your eyes when someone says something you think is weird or dumb.

Walking away or turning your back on someone when they're talking to you.

Thinking before you speak. Asking yourself how the words will make the other person feel.

PICK-A-CARD
Directions

Place students in groups of 4. If a group of 3 is needed, combine the 'fan' and 'respond' jobs.

Students sit in a square with a job board placed between them.

Students complete their jobs in order:

- Person A fans the cards out and directs "Pick a card, any card!"
- Person B picks a card and reads it aloud.
- Person C says whether it is rude or respectful.
- Person D responds to Person C's answer with "I agree BECAUSE..." or "I disagree BECAUSE..." (sharing the why to the answer)

Put used question card in one of two discard piles (rude vs. respectful).

Rotate the jobs board (so everyone has a new job) and continue until all cards have been answered.

After all cards have been sorted, have students discuss the following:




- Which rude examples are big problems in our classroom or school?
- Which respectful examples would you want to do more of yourself?
