It's flexibly designed to accommodate any SEL delivery method or schedule.








Students practice following classroom directions, and identifying if characters are following directions.


Students take turns rolling a die and following the directions to draw a silly monster.

PACING GUIDE (25-30 minute lesson)

- Story (7-10 minutes)
- Whole group activity (choose just 4-6 scenarios 5 to 7 minutes)
- Introduce small group activity (5 minutes)
- Small group practice activity (7-10 minutes)
- Closing circle question: (3-5 minutes)

PACING GUIDE (45 minute lesson)

- Same as above, but use all of the cards scenarios for the whole group activity

- Read a recommended book companion

PACING GUIDE (super mini lessons, weeklong)
