CONFLICT RESOLUTION VISUAL TASK & GAME CARDS



USING THESE CARDS IN SMALL GROUPS

Cooperative Small Group Game:

- Give each student a set of "choices" cards. Flip over "problems" cards one at a time. All group members name and lay down/play the choice card they would use in that situation.
- Give each choice a 'point' when someone picks/uses it to see which choice 'wins' after going through all the problems.

Competitive Small Group Game

 Assign each problem a point value (just write a number on each card). Students take turns pulling problem cards and stating which choice they would use (and possibly acting it out). They earn that number of points. "Bonus" cards included for this option. The student with the most points at the end wins.

With A Card or Board Game (CandyLand, Connect 4, etc.).

- Before each turn, students pull a "problem" card and say what choice they would use to solve it. OR Before each turn, students pull a "choice" card and act it out (or simply name it).
- **Memory Match** (print two sets of the choices cards)

"Pick a Card" (see attached directions)

USING THESE CARDS IN CLASS LESSONS.

 Any of the small group options (model the activity whole group, students complete activity at table groups)

Ask-Ask-Switch

- Give each student a card. Students mix and mingle, find partners. If a student has a choice card, they will ask "When could you use this choice?" If a student has a problem card, they will ask "What could you do if you had this problem?" They answer and then they switch cards, find new partners, and repeat.
- You can project the mini poster during this to provide answer choices for them to respond with.

Team Game

 Students are put in teams. Teams send representatives to pull a card and have the chance to win their team points.
 Write a number on each card you put in the "deck" to denote how many points it's worth, and include the "bonus" cards as well.



Directions
























FAN-N-PICK
